



Biosafety: Biohazards and Risk Mitigation



Course Overview:

Biosafety: Biohazards and Risk Mitigation defines the term biohazard, identifies specific biohazards at PBI, and describes risk mitigation actions.

Who Should Take the Course?

This course should be taken by each new worker as part of their orientation training

Course Objectives:

Upon completion of the course, participants will be able to:

- Define the terms biohazard and risk mitigation
- Identify specific biohazards at PBI
- Recognize the degree of risk associated with red zones and with yellow zones and be able to identify red zones and yellow zones at the PBI facility in Dartmouth, NS
- Describe specific risk mitigation actions at PBI

Evaluation Process:

At the end of the course, participants must successfully pass a multiple-choice test to verify their understanding of the information presented. If a participant does not pass, he/she can review the content and re-test as many times as required to obtain the required score. Test questions are randomly selected from a test bank, making each testing experience unique.

Upon successful completion of the test, each participant can download/print a Certificate of Completion

Course Duration:

The learning experience is self-paced. An individual participant can progress at whatever rate matches his/her learning style, can exit the course whenever necessary, and can resume where he/she left off. On average, the timeline for completion will be 30 minutes.
